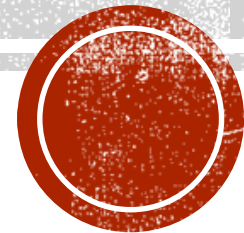

# WHAT SHOULD YOU DO?

First of all, **get together** with your national team group!

# WHAT SHOULD YOU DO?

Secondly, use your skills to find out interesting **facts and figures** to let us know:

- What is **youth criminality/reoffending** situation in your country?
  - Why **young people are/are not looking for a crime** in your country?
- How local NGO's, politicians, private companies are **preventing youth criminality/reoffence** in your country?



# WHAT SHOULD YOU DO?

Don't forget that you might use:

- **Statistics** – f.e. What are youth criminality rates in your country? How did it changed through years? What crimes committed by youth are the most common in your country?
- **Interesting figures** – f.e. What is a profile of typical youth criminal in your country (maybe it is 20 years old ladies from the fancy neighborhood?)
- **Examples** – let us know ongoing youth criminality prevention/reducing reoffending projects in your country! Maybe there are daily centers or best-buddy or other good practises worth to know.
- **Stories** – maybe your best friend once have been caught doing something illegal, but now he is a CEO of well know family business? Maybe you have your own story to share?

And all the other things you find out worth to share with everyone!

Present your story, so everyone would listen!

How? Use visual materials (videos, photos, screenshots of webpages, blogs and etc.), explain it in simple language, stress the key points and share your opinion!
